§3-907 MUNICIPAL CEMETERY; DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY. The Village of Hemingford assumes no responsibility for damage to headstones, benches, vases or urns caused by vandals or caused by deterioration or age of materials.

Any person who shall willfully destroy, mutilate, deface, injure or remove any tomb, monument, or gravestone placed in the Cemetery or any fence, railing or other work for the protection or ornamentation of the Cemetery, or who shall willfully destroy, cut, break, or injure any tree, shrub or plant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. §3-908 MUNICIPAL CEMETERY; REGULATIONS.

Trees and shrubs will not be allowed to be planted on grave sites.

Perennial plants, annual plants, and rose bushes may be planted as long as they do not infringe on other sites and with the supervision of the Cemetery Sexton.

Any planter weighing over fifty (50) pounds must be placed on a cement foundation at the owner's expense and under the supervision of the Cemetery Sexton.

No coping of concrete, stone, brick or other materials will be allowed.

All monuments and stones must be placed on a four (4) inch thick concrete foundation level with the ground no wider than 24", 4 feet long on single lots, 8 feet long on double lots. All monuments and stones must have a permit from the Village Office and must be set with the supervision of the Cemetery Sexton. Any monument or stone taller than three (3) feet must have a steel reinforced foundation. The area must be cleaned and restored to the approval of the Cemetery Sexton after the installation of a monument or stone.

No domestic animals leashed or unrestrained will be allowed in the Cemetery at any time. The only exception being dogs assisting the handicapped.

Any articles that will not fit inside of the casket with the body shall not be allowed to be buried.

Burials in pressed wood caskets will not be allowed at any time. (Ord. No. 656, 1/7/97)
